Abstract

The abstract in MS Word, must follow the guidelines outlined. It should be a single paragraph, fully justified, in Times New Roman 11 pt, and should not exceed 350 words or one page. References should not be included. The paper title should be in uppercase, Times New Roman, Bold, 12 pt. Author names must be in Times New Roman, 11 pt, and affiliations in Times New Roman, 11 pt. The corresponding author's email should be placed below the affiliations in italics, 10 pt. The title, author names, and affiliations must all be centered on the page. The word "Abstract" should appear at the beginning, centered, in Times New Roman, Bold, 11 pt. The abstract itself should clearly present the research question and focus, describe the methodology, summarize the main findings, state the conclusions, and highlight the overall significance or impact of the work. Scientific names should be italics, and should be written according to the standard style.

Keywords: Up to five keywords, should be separated from a semicolon (;)
